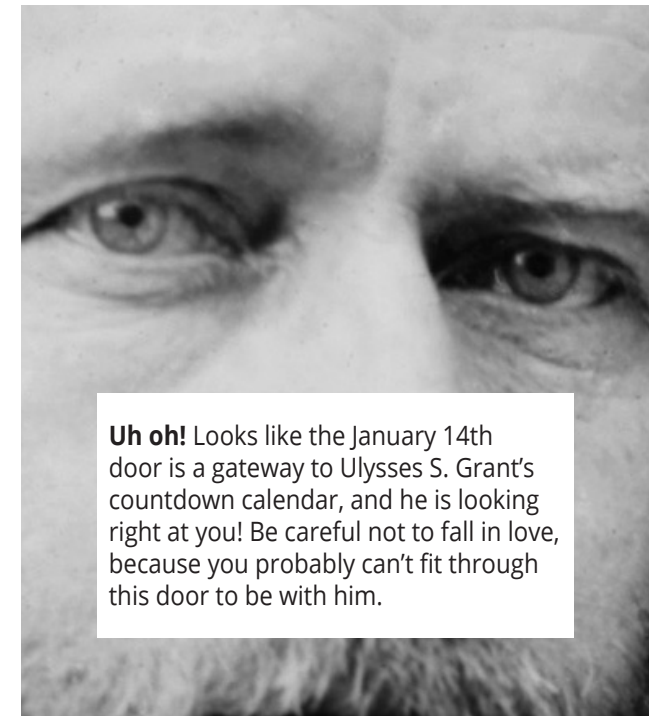

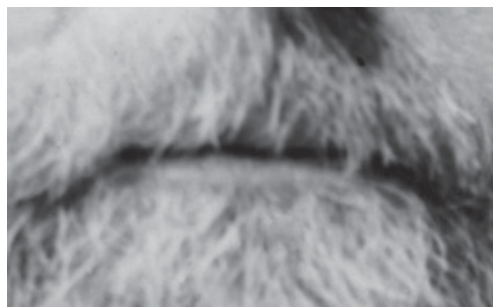
This calendar is missing something, but we're not quite sure what. Why don't we try putting a picture of James Garfield in a funny hat here and see if—ahh, that's better!
